

## **Dr. June Hobbs Presented One of Two Executive Director's Awards**

Dr. June Hobbs of Gardner-Webb University received one of two top awards for faculty members at the April 2-4 national convention of Alpha Chi, the national college honor society, in Indianapolis.

As faculty sponsor of the North Carolina Zeta chapter of Alpha Chi at Gardner-Webb, Hobbs was presented one of two Executive Director's Awards honoring exemplary service to her chapter and to the society. The award carried a \$500 stipend.

Announcing the new award, Dr. Dennis Organ, executive director, said, "We value the work of the men and women who serve our local chapters and often extend their volunteer spirit to assignments at the regional and national level. Alpha Chi literally could not exist without them."

Noting that Hobbs has served a relatively short time as head sponsor of her chapter, Organ remarked that the record of activity of the chapter under her leadership has been impressive—locally, on the regional level, and at national conventions. At the Indianapolis convention alone she had eight students making academic presentations.

The North Carolina Zeta chapter was chartered in 1972. Hobbs' predecessor as chapter sponsor was Dr. Robert Morgan, who served many years in that position. Alpha Chi has more than 300 active chapters in almost every state and Puerto Rico and inducts about 11,000 members annually from the top 10 percent of the junior, senior, and graduate classes in all academic fields.
