Global Outreach Internships

In the summer of 2011 Global Outreach sent 33 interns to live and work with missionaries in 9 countries on 5 continents including Belgium, the Czech Republic, Bolivia, Peru, Kenya, Zambia, Mozambique, India, and Papua New Guinea. Most if not all of the interns expressed that their internship challenged them in many ways, expanded their perspective on God's kingdom, and drew them into a closer walk with Christ. Their experiences were as varied as the settings in which they worked, but they all witnessed first-hand the challenges and joys that come with long-term, cross cultural ministry. Our interns in Mumbai India experienced the challenges of ministry in the monsoon season as they waded through flooded streets to be able to study the Bible with Hindus

CAMT Students Will Travel to Israel in May 2012

Thirty students, alumni, and friends associated with the Bachelor of Ministry and Master of Ministry degree programs within the Center for Advanced Ministry Training, will be traveling to Israel May 13-23 for a nine-day tour of biblical sites. Arriving at Tel Aviv, the group will begin at Caesarea Maritime, Mt. Carmel, and Nazareth and travel to sites around the Sea of Galilee. Biblical Caesarea Philippi and Dan will be visited in northern Israel before traveling south via Mt. Tabor and Megiddo. In southern Israel, the group will visit such sites as Jericho, En Gedi, Qumran and Masada before moving on to Jerusalem and its environs.

in their homes. A group of five interns partnered with *Made in the Streets*, a mission to the homeless children of Nairobi. They taught classes, mentored troubled teens and shared their faith with newly found friends. Many interns were exposed to urban mission contexts, working with churches in the cities of South America and Europe. In Papua New Guinea, interns were able to encourage brand new village churches and, in their free time, volunteered at the local Hospital. In Mozambique, they were faced with the challenges of reaching the folk-Islamic Makua people, but filled with joy at their responsiveness to the gospel.

by participation in classes prior to travel and through the knowledge acquired on the trip. The group will work on a collective project to organize 250 photographs of Israel into albums, accompanied by historical, geographic, biblical, and devotional notes suitable for preaching and teaching. This resource will better equip them for their own future ministries and, in addition, the photos will be made available to individuals who donate to the group's travel funds. Current students are raising funds for travel through various avenues and the production of a CD of annotated photos is one of those efforts.
