Requirements for the Program

Admission to the Program – All candidates must meet the following criteria:

1. Hold a valid teaching license and have two years of teaching experience in the area for which you are seeking licensure (P-8 or 7-12).
2. Earned an undergraduate GPA of at least a 2.75.
3. Successfully complete an entrance interview and an impromptu writing sample.
4. Provide satisfactory references from three people that know your professional abilities.
5. Submit written support from your immediate supervisor and a commitment to allow you to participate in field experiences and the internship.

Graduation Requirements

1. All candidates must complete the 32 hour program of study, a 4 hour internship (two-two hour classes), and a professional portfolio that is presented to a review committee.
2. A cumulative grade point average of at least a 3.0 must be achieved in all graduate work.
3. Thirty hours of graduate work must be taken at Harding University.
