

Harding in Zambia Fund Raising Policy

Students in the Harding in Zambia (HIZ) program participate in legitimate evangelistic and compassionate mission work. While in Zambia they work several hours daily in the Namwianga medical clinic and children's homes and make weekend church planting visits to villages in the bush, logging more than 300 hours over a three-month period. Although HIZ is primarily an academic program for which students can earn up to 16 hours credit, Harding's Center for World Missions also endorses this work as a valid mission experience comparable to a summer internship or campaign and enthusiastically will receive donated funds for HIZ students under the following conditions:

1. Students can raise up to \$3600 in funds donated by churches and individuals. This is average airfare and expense incurred for a two-month summer missions internship in Africa.
2. Students must be enrolled in BMIS 387, BMIN 423, or NURS 344 to insure adequate guidance and accountability.
3. Students should file an application with the Global Outreach office and pay an administrative fee of \$50. The funds will go to pay for accounting and fund raising mailing materials. Students should submit a copy of their schedule to demonstrate that they are enrolled in BMIS 387, BMIN 423, or NURS 344.
4. All funds must be received by June 30th.
