The nursing faculty supports the liberal arts and Bible based course offerings on Harding's campus and the many opportunities available for student learning experiences. We encourage you to avail yourself of these throughout your education. We recommend the following in planning your studies:

- A. **Consider obtaining a Health Missions minor.** Mission and health care mission opportunities abound. BMIS 388 and NURS 344, 210, 305 and 413 can enrich your skills and knowledge in health care missions. Details are available in the Harding Catalog and specifics can be provided by the Carr College of Nursing Health Missions Coordinator.
- B. **NURS 367 is available as a cooperative education clinical experience.** See your advisor for details.
- C. **Use advisor's assistance to plan a schedule to best fit your learning needs.**
- D. **BMIS 388, Development Ministries, is available annually during intersession.** The course is a global village experience at HUT (Harding University at Camp Tahkodah), built and operated by Harding University. The course meets global literacy requirements and is co-taught by nursing and Bible faculty.
- E. **All non-nursing course transfer credit is approved through the Registrar's Office;** prior written approval is required.
