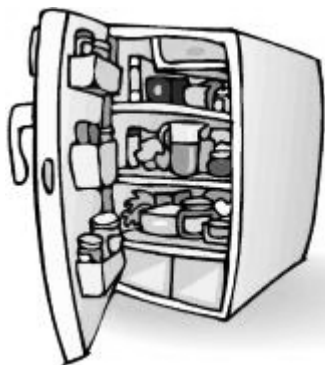


## PLEASE READ!!! ● **JMPORTANT** Suggestions about WHAT TO BRING



- One small (dorm-size, not apartment-size) **refrigerator per room** is allowed. Must be 1.6 amps or less and approved by U.L. The optimal size is 2.5 cubic feet or smaller, but larger ones are allowed if they meet the amperage requirement. Any refrigerators over 2.5 cubic feet must be placed on the floor. One **700-watt microwave** is allowed **per room**.
- Table lamps (no halogen lamps), a small radio/stereo, a television (there is one cable connection per room), VCR/DVD Players, and Video Games are also allowed.  
Large furniture (including couches, loveseats, or recliners) is not allowed.
- Students are not permitted to have stoves in their rooms; however, you may use small toaster ovens, crock-pots, coffee makers, popcorn poppers, small electric grills, and toasters to prepare light snacks.
- If a refrigerator, microwave, or other item does not meet the above requirements, it will have to be removed. Items will also have to be removed if they are used in such a way as to cause damage to the room or become a hindrance in keeping the room clean. No other appliances (i.e., cola machines, commercial-size games, candy machines, or other vending machines) are permitted in the rooms.

### Other items to consider ...

- Mirrors are provided in the rooms.
- If your room is not carpeted, you may want to bring an area or edge-bound rug.
- Be sure to bring an adequate supply of towels and face cloths.
- You may also wish to bring an iron and ironing board.
- Certain items are not provided by the University but will be very helpful to you in your time in the residence hall. These items include **shower curtains/rings, vacuum cleaners/sweepers, mops, brooms, and dust cloths**.
- It is best to purchase cleaning chemicals and supplies locally after you see what works best in your residence hall.
- Necessary items are available at the University bookstore in the Student Center and at stores within walking distance of campus.
- Due to fire safety concerns, certain items are not allowed in the residence halls. These items include but are not limited to **candles/candle warmers/incense, space heaters, & halogen lamps**.
- Bikes must be stored in outside racks that are provided.
- Personal property should be covered by personal or homeowner's/renter's insurance. The University is not responsible for loss or damage. **Please keep a list of all serial numbers**.
- Suggestive posters/display items (hard-rock posters, satanic symbols, scantily-clad bodies, alcohol advertisements, etc.) are not in harmony with Harding's Christian mission and are prohibited.

All beds are twin size (extra-long twins in Armstrong, Cone, Graduate, Harbin, & Keller).



You will need a mattress cover, sheets, pillow/pillow case, & blankets/bedspread.

**For obvious safety reasons**, the possession or use of weapons of any kind is prohibited in the residence halls and on campus. Weapons brought for the purpose of hunting must be registered and stored with the HU Department of Public Safety.



According to University policy, the following items are considered prohibited weapons: **firearms, firearm replicas, BB/pellet guns, fireworks, explosive devices, archery equipment, paintball guns, ammunition, knives (other than pocket knives), slingshots, darts/dartboards, launching devices, etc.**



No pets of any kind, including fish, lizards, birds, etc., are ever permitted in the residence halls.



Self-service coin laundries are located on campus.
