- Complete the Communication Sciences and Disorders graduate program application. (available online or by request)
- Complete the Essential Skills Form for the Master of Science in Speech-Language Pathology program. (available online or by request)
- Send **official** transcripts from each college and/or university attended since leaving high school. (Harding undergraduate students are not required to submit transcripts.)
- Send unofficial student copy of transcript showing grades for Fall semester.
- Send **official** Graduate Record Examination (GRE) scores to Harding University (ETS institution code 6267).
- Send (or have sent) completed Graduate School Readiness Scale with accompanying releases from three individuals (faculty members or supervisors) in sealed envelopes with signature of recommender across back flap. (available online or by request)
- Narrative (approximately 500 words) of your professional plans (career and/or further graduate studies).
- Resume (including honors/awards, work experience and two personal references).
- Application fee of \$40.00. (Make check payable to Harding University.)
