Commitment to Safety: Harding University is committed to providing a safe, congenial and secure environment for our students, faculty, staff and guests. With the support of all members of our campus community, there is a continuing effort to keep the campus safe and secure. Because a truly safe campus can only be achieved through the cooperation of all students, faculty and staff, we hope that you will join our effort to ensure that this endeavor is effective.

Reporting Crimes: Students, faculty and staff are encouraged to report all crimes or security issues immediately. Students may report issues directly to their professors or other staff members. In the event of an emergency that requires the assistance of local emergency services, students and employees should call 9-1-1. All security-related issues should be reported to the director or assistant director as quickly as possible.

Access to Buildings and Security Considerations in the Maintenance of Buildings: The NWAPC Building has proximity card access control that limits access to the main entrances on the east and west sides of the building outside regular business hours. Faculty and staff are responsible for checking doors to make sure they are secured after use. The director and assistant director communicate regularly with the facilities manager and custodial staff to assure doors, lights, access control, etc... is all in good working order.
