

Harding University Honors Symposium

Summer 2010

The Harding Honors Symposium is a two-week academic program on the Searcy campus that is designed to challenge, encourage, and uplift high school students who are now in their junior year and has been offered every summer since 1993. Students accepted into the Symposium attend class with outstanding professors, engage in community service projects, enjoy recreational activities and invariably form lasting friendships with other junior scholars. Three hours of (transferable) university credit are awarded to all who successfully complete the Symposium, the content of which is designed to appeal to students of both the humanities and the sciences. Admission to the Symposium is treated on an individual basis with special consideration given to grade point average, a score from any nationally standardized test (ACT, SAT, PSAT, PACT, etc.), and a letter of reference.

Four sessions are scheduled for the summer of 2010; the first session is June 25 --July 9, the second July 2 -- July 16 the third July 9 -- 23, and the fourth is July 16 -- 30. An anonymous donor has generously contributed to the cost of the Symposium program (tuition, room, board, and recreational fees). With the contribution awarded to enrollees, the total cost is only \$795 per student.

Please complete the attached application form and return it along with a \$250 deposit and a recent photograph to hold your place in the 2010 class. (The balance of \$545 will be due June 1, 2010.) To complete your application, please ask a teacher or guidance counselor to send a letter of reference; a copy of your high school transcript is also required.
