



Articulation Agreement between Harding University and Crowley's Ridge College

In Fall 2022, a Memorandum of Understanding (herinafter "MOU"), was entered into by and between **HARDING UNIVERSITY** (hereinafter, "HU"), located at 915 E. Market Avenue, Searcy, AR 72149-5615 and **CROWLEY'S RIDGE COLLEGE** (hereinafter "CRC"), located at 100 College Drive, Paragould, Arkansas 72450. Over time, university requirements change, course codes change, and program requirements change, therefore, adjustments need to be made to individual articulation agreements attached to the original MOU. Additionally, other programs may want to create articulation agreements.

The purpose of this document is to acknowledge the addition of an articulation agreement and the changes being made to the previous articulation agreements between HU and CRC. New and updated documents effective for the 2024-2025 school year are attached.

Continuing Articulation Agreements	Revision Reference	Additional Requirements

This articulation agreement update will be effective from the final date of execution of this agreement below and will be automatically renewed, unless terminated by either party. Students who have been working under a previous articulation agreement within a year of acceptance and entry into HU will be worked with to create a seamless transfer. Either party may terminate this agreement with or without cause. If either party wishes to terminate this agreement, they must do so in writing one year in advance of the requested termination date.
