Harding PA Program Effectiveness in Meeting Goals

Goal 1: Equip PA students to deliver competent and ethical care from a Christian perspective

The program's goal is to prepare graduates who demonstrate competence in PA practice and uphold the highest ethical standards, guided by a Christian worldview. Achievement of this goal is assessed through competency-based evaluations conducted throughout the curriculum, graduate outcomes including performance on the national certification examination, and student feedback at graduation regarding both their confidence in these areas and the integration of Christian principles as reflected in the Christian Bioethics course and faculty evaluations.

The survey uses a Likert scale (1-Needs improvement, 2-Adequate, 3-Strong, 4-Very strong).

²The PAS 6110 Christian Bioethics course evaluation is administered at the close of the course. The survey uses a Likert scale (1-Strongly

Disagree, 2-Disagree, 3-Neither agree nor disagree, 4-Agree, 5-Strongly agree).

³The preceptor evaluation of the student is administered at the close of every clinical rotation. The reported number is an average for all students from all rotations during the clinical phase. For the Class of 2023 and 2024 the survey uses a Likert scale (3-Competent, 2-Inconsistent, 1-Incompetent). Beginning with the Class of 2025 the Likert scale is updated to 1-Poor, 2-Below Average, 3-Average, 4-Above Average, 5-Superior in response to preceptor feedback.

⁴Student evaluations of faculty are administered at the close of every semester for each principal faculty member. The surveys use a Likert scale (1-Strongly Disagree, 2-Disagree, 3-Neither agree nor disagree, 4-Agree, 5-Strongly agree). The average represents all evaluations throughout the year.

Goal 2: Encourage skills in lifelong learning and professional development including participation in professional organizations

Throughout the program, faculty intentionally equip students with the skills and mindset needed for lifelong learning and ongoing professional growth. This commitment is reinforced through participation in professional organizations and the structured Master's Project, which is designed to foster critical thinking, emphasize preventive care, and improve community health outcomes. By engaging with the COPC framework, students gain practical experience that prepares them for a career of continual learning and professional development.

Achievement of this goal is demonstrated through strong performance on Master's Project evaluations and course assessments, high levels of graduate-reported confidence in their commitment to professional development and in the program's preparation for professional life, consistent participation in professional organizations during and after the program from survey respondents, and preceptor evaluations of students' engagement in lifelong learning throughout clinical experiences.

Goal 3: Promote supportive professional relationships among faculty, staff, and students

The program is committed to fostering a supportive and collaborative learning environment where faculty, staff, and students encourage one another, reflecting the teamwork essential to professional practice. Progress toward this goal is measured through student participation in volunteer mentor groups, student feedback on the level of support and faculty accessibility, and graduate confidence in carrying this skill into their own professional practice.

Goal 4: Prepare students to engage collaboratively with clinical teams and display curiosity in interactions

The program strives to instill a curious and inquisitive mindset in students, encouraging them to use this mindset as a tool for effective collaboration within healthcare teams. Achievement of this goal is measured through preceptor evaluations of student performance across clinical rotations and graduate confidence in their ability to continue applying these skills in professional practice.

Goal 5. Prepare graduates for servant leadership by engaging them in meaningful community service and developing their ability to provide culturally respectful care

The program is committed to cultivating a servant leadership mindset in its students. A key component of this commitment is the facilitation of events that provide no-cost pre-participation physical examinations to medically underserved populations, including local school students with limited access to healthcare and Special Olympics athletes. Conducted once per semester, these events deliver more than 300 physicals annually while fostering meaningful partnerships with community leaders.

Servant leadership is further emphasized through the integration of cultural humility and cross-cultural training across the curriculum. This training has expanded from 20 to 40 designated hours through the addition of experiential learning opportunities, ensuring students develop the skills needed to engage diverse patient populations with respect and empathy.

Progress toward this goal is measured by student participation in service events, continued program sponsorship of these activities, preceptor assessments of student performance, and graduate confidence and ongoing engagement in servant leadership after program completion.
