

Inclement Weather Policy for Distance Delivery Bible

The university inclement weather policy states: “Classes meeting at off-campus sites will be handled on a case-by-case basis by the dean or director of the college or center offering the class. Every effort will be made for decisions on evening classes to be made available by 2:00 pm.”

The following steps should be taken in the event that weather interferes with Bible classes held in remote locations:

1. Teachers or students may contact the Distance Delivery Bible office to express safety concerns regarding class attendance. (tel. 501-279-4660; twestbrook@harding.edu)
2. The Distance Delivery Bible office will determine whether classes will be held at remote sites. Bible class cancellation at non-Searcy Harding facilities, such as the NW Ark. Profession Center or the North Little Rock campus, will follow the inclement weather decisions of those offices.
3. The Distance Delivery Bible office will notify the COBR deans’ office and VPAA if classes are cancelled.
4. The Distance Delivery Bible office will notify IS&T and request an announcement to be posted on Pipeline to indicate a cancelled class.
5. The Distance Delivery Bible office will notify students and teachers of a cancellation via Harding email as soon as a decision is made.
6. Teachers and students must make up lost contact hours.
