ROSS COCHRAN



Having joined Harding's College of Bible and Ministry faculty in 1986, Dr. Ross Cochran has served as a professor of practical theology since 2007. He retires today after 38 years of service to the University.

Dr. Cochran graduated from Harding in 1979 with a bachelor's degree in Bible. He earned a Master of Theology from Harding Graduate School of Religion in 1984 and a Doctor of Philosophy in 1994 from Boston College.

Dr. Cochran previously served as a minister at the Holmes Road Church of Christ in Memphis, Tennessee, the Natick Church of Christ in Massachusetts, and the Downtown Church of Christ in Searcy, where he was also a shepherd from 2007-2021. He served as director of Camp Tahkodah from 2004-2011.

He is the author of several publications including *Not Off Limits: Questions You Wish You Could Ask at Church.* Currently, he is constructing a curriculum to train communicators for Heartbeat, the ministry of Landon Saunders.

He is a member of the boards for White County's chapter of Court Appointed Special Advocates and Kibo Group's Midnight Oil Coffeehouse.

Dr. Cochran received the Alpha Chi Faculty Award in 2000, the Petit Jean yearbook dedication in 1996 and 2017, and the Teacher Achievement Award in 1999, 2006 and 2024. As a three-time recipient, he is now recognized as a distinguished professor.

He and his first wife, Nita Allen, were married for 35 years until her death in 2016. In January 2022, he married Stephanie Carter Howell. His children are Chris Cochran, his wife, Caroline, Allen Cochran, and Hannah Cochran. His blended family includes Katherine Howell Yates, and her husband, Addison, and Emma Howell Ashburn, and her husband, William.

HARDING UNIVERSITY

Harding University has a rich history of quality education. Harding was chartered as a senior college in 1924 when two junior colleges, Arkansas Christian College and Harper College, merged their facilities and assets, adopted the new name of Harding College, and located on the campus of Arkansas Christian in Morrilton, Arkansas. The school was moved to Searcy in 1934, and the board of trustees approved a recommended change of Harding to university status in 1979.

Harding was named in memory of James A. Harding, a pioneer Christian educator who founded Nashville Bible School (now Lipscomb University) in Tennessee. He challenged his co-workers with an enthusiasm for Christian education that remains a significant tradition at Harding University.

At the charter, J.N. Armstrong, who had served five years as Harper's president, became president of Harding College, holding the office from 1924 to 1936.

In 1936, George S. Benson returned from mission work in China to assume the presidency of his alma mater. Benson directed the college from a deep indebtedness into a state of financial stability, national recognition and academic accreditation. He retired in 1965 after 29 years of tireless service.

Dr. Clifton L. Ganus Jr., a 1943 graduate, served as president from 1965 to 1987. A former history department chair and vice president of the college, Ganus kept alive his predecessors' drive for excellence by leading a plan of campus improvement and expansion. At his retirement, Ganus became Harding's first chancellor in 1987 and then served as chancellor emeritus from 2013 until his death in September 2019.

Dr. David Burks became the fourth president in 1987. A 1965 graduate, he has been a member of the faculty since 1967 and served as dean of the College of Business Administration. Under his leadership, the University experienced record growth in enrollment and giving and, more importantly, placed significant emphasis on Christian servanthood.

Dr. Bruce McLarty, a 1978 graduate and the University's fifth president, served as president from 2013 to 2020. Prior to this role, McLarty was the first vice president of spiritual life for the University. As the result of his doctoral work, the University adopted his five-chapter curriculum, "Embracing the Mission," which focuses on maintaining the faith-based principles Harding was built upon.

Chancellor David Burks resumed the role of president in December 2020 and served until Harding's sixth president, Dr. Michael D. Williams, assumed the role on June 1, 2022. At President Williams' inauguration in September 2022, he challenged the Harding community to find and develop their Inspired Purpose, remaining committed to our historic Christian mission as we aspire to restore the world to what God intended from the beginning. Harding's 4,804 students, representing 47 states and more than 50 nations and territories, are empowered for ministry, leadership and lifetimes of service.
