

## **Harding University Policy on Campus Sexual Violence**

### **NCAA Student-Athlete Serious Misconduct**

In accordance with the NCAA Board of Governors Policy on Campus Sexual Violence, each year student-athletes must disclose whether they have engaged in conduct that resulted in discipline through a Title IX proceeding or in a criminal conviction for sexual, interpersonal, or other acts of violence. Transfer student-athletes must also disclose whether a Title IX proceeding was incomplete at the time of transfer.

Each summer, the Harding University Department of Athletics sends incoming, transfer, and current student-athletes the Harding University Student-Athlete Serious Misconduct Attestation form. The form is completed by the student and returned to the Department of Athletics. A copy of the attestation form is maintained by the Harding University Title IX Coordinator. Failure by a student-athlete to make a full and accurate disclosure could result in penalties, including loss of eligibility to participate in athletics as determined by the Harding University Department of Athletics.

Student-Athletes are also sent an NCAA Policy on Campus Sexual Violence Institutional Disclosure form by the Harding University Department of Athletics. The top portion of the form is completed by the student-athlete. Incoming student-athletes must then provide the form to any high schools attended within the last five years for verification of Title IX disciplinary proceedings and/or criminal convictions for sexual, interpersonal, or other acts of violence. Transfer student-athletes must fill out the top portion of the form and return it to the Department of Athletics. The Department of Athletics will then email the form to all schools attended by the transfer student-athlete within the last five years for verification of Title IX disciplinary proceedings and/or criminal convictions for sexual, interpersonal, or other acts of violence. A copy of the NCAA Policy on Campus Sexual Violence Institutional Disclosure form is maintained by the Harding University Title IX Coordinator.
